



SUSTAINABILITY

ADVANCING COMMUNITY GOALS

In 2025, Missoula's Long Range Transportation Plan recommitted to reducing the drive alone rate by over half (from 72% to 34%) not only to lower emissions, but also to increase the capacity of existing infrastructure.

MIM's trip logging platform, Way to Go Missoula, helps move the needle in our community's transportation habits one bus, bike, walk, or carpool trip at a time!






Lights to Middle Schoolers

PRIORITIZING BIKE PARKING

MIM manages a fleet of temporary bike parking options that can be rented out by local businesses and non-profits. The fleet includes both lockable bike racks as well as valet-style racks designed for quick setup and convenient bike valet service.
